Mediation-An Option Worth Exploring

Mediation is a form of alternative dispute resolution process in which a third party, usually professionally trained, helps the parties to resolve the dispute, said Mr. Sriram Panchu, Senior Advocate practising before the Madras High Court and other Courts. Opening his speech, Mr. Panchu said that he was a member of RCM years ago, which he had to quit for professional reasons.

Speaking of the advantages of mediation, Mr. Panchu said that time, costs and relationships are the three important factors which take a back seat in the popular forms of resolution of disputes such as resolution through the mechanism of Court or Arbitration. Mediation instead, as a mode of dispute resolution saves time, costs and also the relationship between the parties to a dispute. He said that mediation can be initiated either at the behest of the courts in a pending litigation or parties to the dispute can themselves voluntarily seek mediation without the intervention of the court.

Explaining procedure how mediation works, he said that anything which transpires during the course of mediation is kept confidential by the mediator and the method of resolution of dispute not being adversarial, the mediator is not constrained to look at mere legal rights of the parties but travels to the root of the dispute to take care of the actual needs and the long term interest of the parties to the dispute. For this purpose, a good mediator, he says, should win the confidence and the trust of

the parties, in order to enable the parties to open up to the mediator.

In the event of a successful resolution of the dispute which was hitherto pending before a court, the terms of resolution drawn up with the consent of the parties to a dispute, are duly recorded in a memorandum which is filed before the court to be made the rule of the court. As terms of resolution are drawn up with consent, it is a win-win situation for both



the parties. Unlike a court order which can normally be a subject matter of appeal to a higher court, disputes resolved through mediation cannot be appealed further and thus a quietus is given to the issue. However, in the event of failure of the process of mediation, a failure report will be filed before the court on receipt of which, the court would after a prolonged hearing adjudicate the dispute on the merits of each party's case.

Speech was well received by the members of the club and Mr. Panchu fielded several questions from the members.

Financial Support

Clubs and districts apply for and receive Foundation grants to carry out many worthy projects worldwide. The Every Rotarian, Every Year initiative, designed to encourage worldwide annual per capita giving of \$100 or more, supports vital Foundation programs.

It is a matter of pride that the first Director of Rotary International from India was none other than Sir F.E.James of the Rotary Club of Madras. He served from 1933-34.

Sir James added another first to his credit when he became the first Governor of District 89 in 1936- 37 and served a second term in 1938-39. The first District Conference was held during his tenure as Governor in 1937.

He lived the Rotary motto :“He profits most who serves best”. He was a member of the State and Central legislatures in India for over 20 years. He served as General Secretary of the YMCA, Calcutta, from 1920 1928. His tenure in India was Rotary's gain. He shifted back to England as Managing Director, Tatas Ltd., London and died in 1971.

1. Sholinganallur plant has capacity to produce 4 lakh litres of milk per day i.e. 10% of Chennai demand.
2. Plant operates 365x24x7 irrespective of festivals/holidays.
3. Plant woks in 3 shifts.
4. Only milk is processed in Sholinganallur plant which is the 3rd plant after Madhavaram and Ambattur.
5. 20lakh litres are pasteurized every hour in Shozinganallur plant.
6. India's 1st fully automated milk processing plant.
7. Most of the waste is reused for bio-fuel.
8. In villages, milkmen are paid on basis of fat content and SNF content rather than the quantity.

complete walkthrough of the processes and facts about Aavin were presented. The crux was the process and a few facts which helped us break our myths about milk and milk processing. The presentation made us eager to witness how milk is processed and stored.

We were guided to the reception point where milk is received in tankers and tested (for temperature, fat content, etc.) before transferring them to the silos (storage units). In the control room we witnessed the operators controlling every activity of the process with a single click. Then we proceeded to the pasteurization unit milk is heated at 75°C and cooled at 5°C for 15 seconds to kill the bacteria in this process. After this we witnessed some live tests at the Quality lab where we were shown with the help of a lactometer, how one could find out the ratio of water added in milk this got

Rotarian Marco Polo! ♦ RTN. RITA CHAUDHURI

The 1920's saw an explosion of Rotary International the world over. Clubs opened in Africa, Europe, Australia, Hawaii, Philippines, China, New Zealand, South America, Central America and India. And most of the credit goes to Rotarian James Wheeler Davidson, from Calgary, Canada who took a year off work to sail with his family across the world with the mission of introducing and opening Rotary clubs. He could not have foreseen the marvellous success of his trip where he managed to get clubs established all over Asia and the Middle East. But this success for Rotary came at a huge personal price for him. It took three years before he could return home, beset with illness and paid \$250,000 of his own money to finance the trip. Davidson however, embraced this task joyfully "everything about him was big: body, head, brain, voice, laugh, heart, purpose, love of Rotary". He was responsible for founding our very own Rotary Club of Madras in 1929.

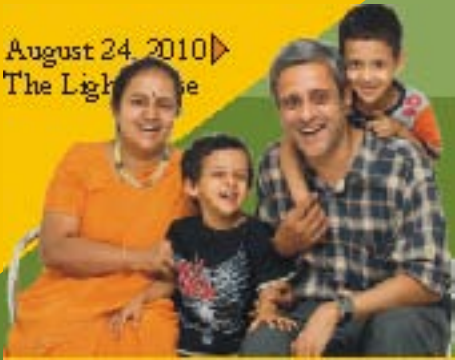
